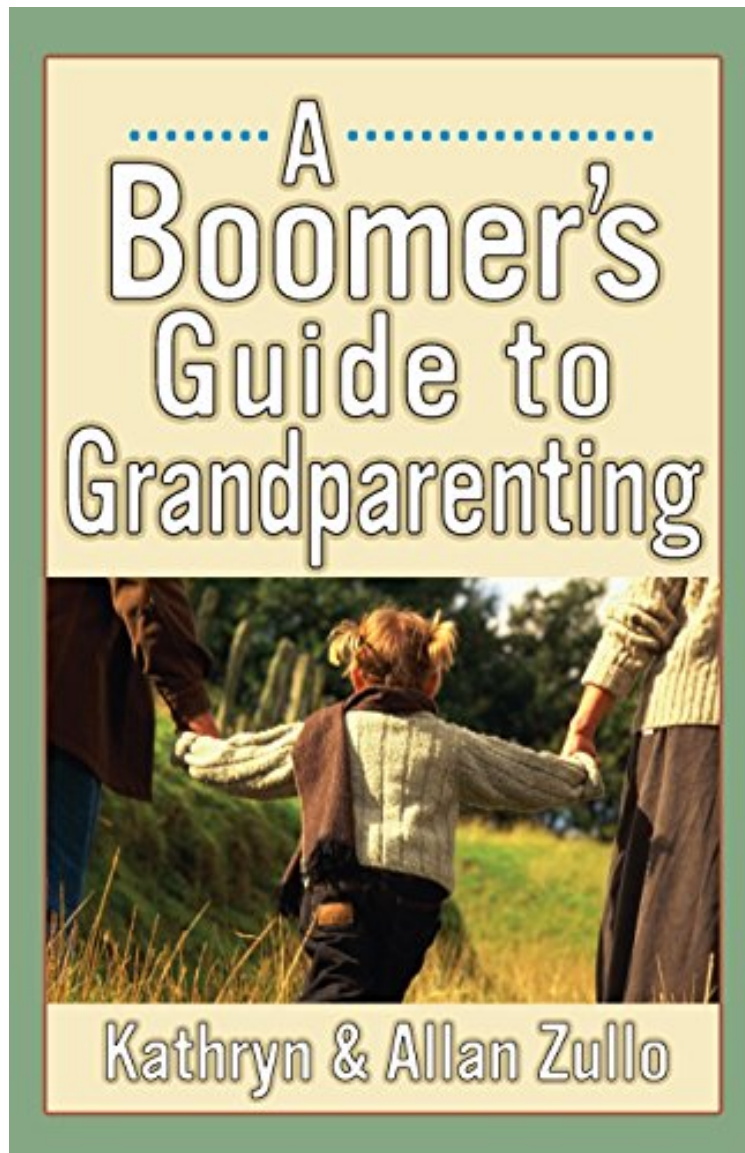

In particular, I want a guide that is about new guidelines for taking care of a baby, one that takes into account the fact that

doctors', psychologists', and other experts' advice has changed from 30 years ago when the new twenty-first-century grandparents were raising their own children. Things like -- put the baby to bed on her back, not her stomach; how to use time-outs; don't feed the baby peanutbutter or put sunscreen containing PABA on him before a certain age...and so on. I'd hoped that "A Boomer's Guide to Grandparenting" would offer an overview of such changes, but aside from a page and a half of useful information, it is, unfortunately, a series of anecdotes about how the new generation of richer, healthier, and all-around cooler grandparents feel about their grandchildren. (Predictably, they feel about the same as grandparents have always felt -- thrilled.)
