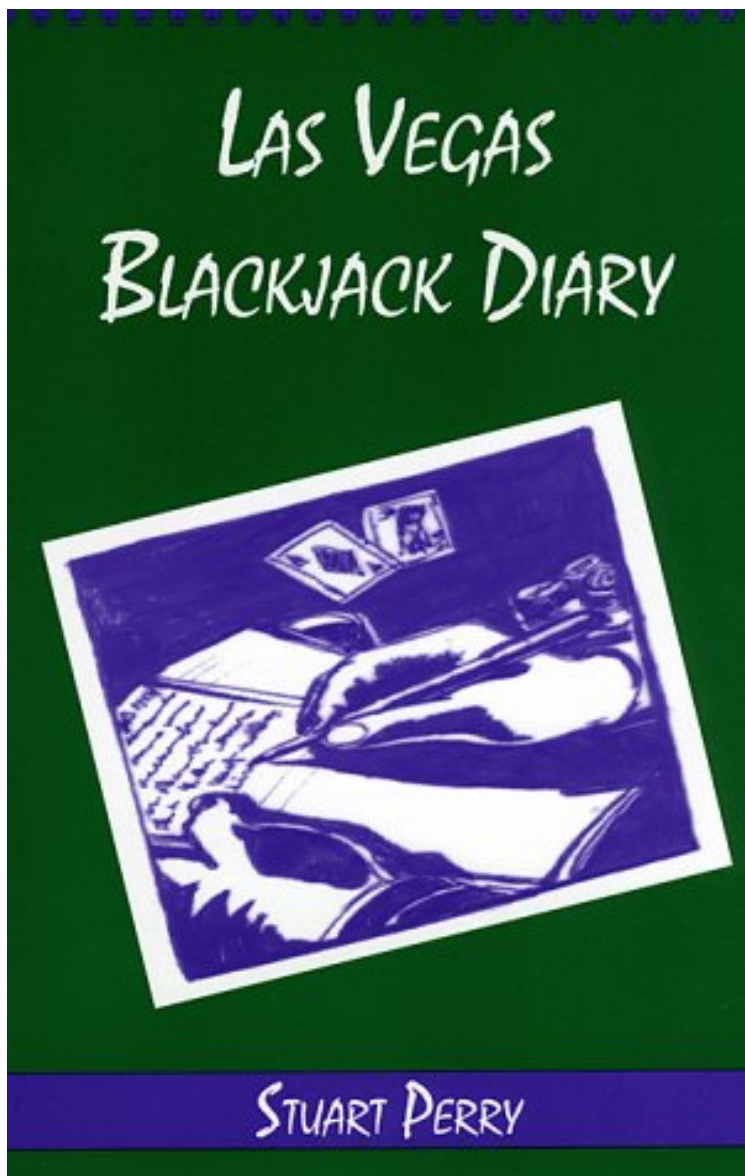

show : Stuart Perry relates excellently well his experiences playing card counting in Las Vegas, games being difficult to beat as most casinos are using shoe games, shuffling machines other countermeasures to protect their bottom line. Table selection (TARGET by Jerry L. Patterson) or card clumping strategies (Blackjack Masters Course by Jerry L. Patterson, New Blackjack and World Class Blackjack by Clifton E. Davies or Precision Blackjack by Ron Benedetto) would be better strategies for these games, counting may still be useful in single double-deck games that are gradually mushrooming in numbers in Las Vegas all over! For eight weeks in early 1994 the author played blackjack in Las Vegas for stakes of up to two hands of \$200. This book describes what happens at every one of the 269 sessions that he played. Perry describes the cover he used, the heat he received, dealer and player interactions, and the mental and financial ups and downs which he experienced.
