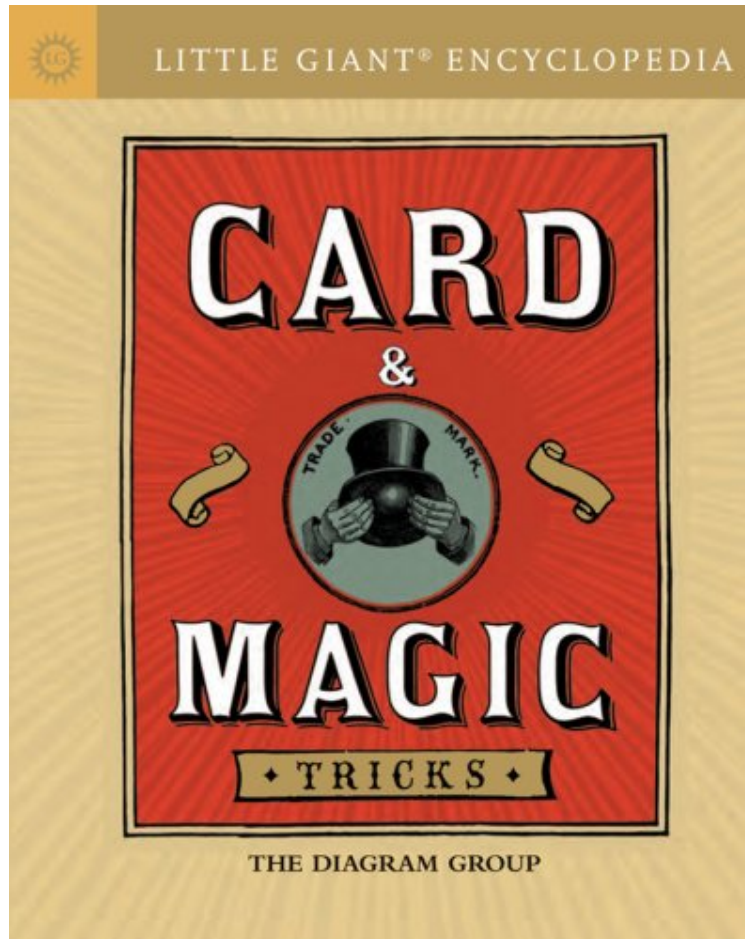

It is loaded with 500 pages of tricks. The first half of the book ("section 1"), is card tricks. This section is divided into further sections of types of card tricks such as "tricks using key cards", "mathematical card tricks", "tricks using sleight of hand", etc. Section 2 of the book is magic tricks, and it is divided into sections such as "coin magic", "paper magic", "string and rope magic", "miscellaneous magic", etc. There is an amazing variety of tricks. One really great tool at the end of the book is a grading system index for the difficulty of the tricks. It ranges from simple tricks to tricks requiring skill and practice and has the
