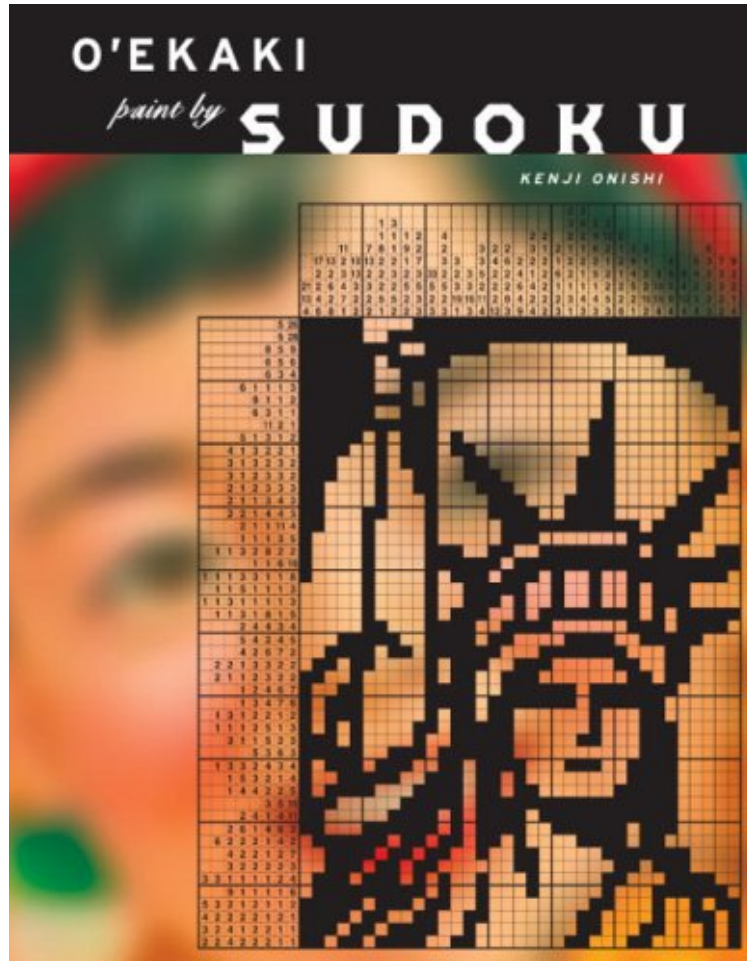

This one isn't bad though, the puzzles are arranged one on a page with cute titles that hint at the final picture, and are rated easy to hard in ascending order. I haven't gotten past moderate level puzzles yet but so far I'm unimpressed with the pictures. This type of puzzle is a great deal of fun and shouldn't need the title gimmick to get people to try them. If you've never heard of them, go ahead and do a search on the web for some sample puzzles to try. I happen to have an addiction to these puzzles. This particular book has various levels of difficulty although it would be best suited for beginner to intermediate griddler solvers. Advanced solvers may find even the difficult puzzles a little too easy, but they're still fun to do and helps pass time on the train. Printed on good paper. If you don't have someone to show you, there are solving instructions at the beginning of this book.
