This is some of the most amazing material I have ever heard. The big band remotes, the comedy shows, the Goldberg's, Columbia Workshop, The Joey Brown Show, the live commercials, a full live baseball game, soap operas, Louis Prima, Arthur Godfrey, AND the very rare Amos and Andy episode.....AND Vic and Sade and on and on!... but most of all the War news from Europe, President Roosevelt's speech, the battle between the isolationist and the warmongers. It echos today and there are uncountable lessons to be learned within this audio.

On Thursday, September 21st, 1939, radio station WJSV (CBS) in Washington, D.C., recorded their entire broadcast day -- from

sign on, to sign off. This was before the advent of magnetic recording tape, so transcription disks were used. The overall quality of these disk recordings is good to excellent, except for a few spots of noticeable distortion and drop out. This collection is the complete broadcast day of the Columbia Broadcasting System's radio station WJSV AM, Washington, D.C. September, 21, 1939, was recorded in part because of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's address to Congress. This twenty-fifth special session speech covered FDR's plans to change existing neutrality laws in light of the coming European war. You will hear everything as it was the day it was recorded -- that includes the pops and crackles, the station breaks, and the technical difficulties, along with all the music, comedy, drama, soap operas, a quiz show, war news, baseball, and advertisements that were aired on September 21st, 1939. Let this One Day in 1939 be your personal time machine, as you traveled back to those days when 15 cents would buy a hamburger, a six-pack of Coke costs a quarter, and the future was on display at the 1939 New York World's Fair.
