The jokes sometimes are little old but that doesn't make them any less funny and there is such a warmth to Phil, Alice and the gang that you can't help but laugh along. I also enjoy the songs that are neatly shoe horned in, normally with a nicely timed joke about Phil scaring people off or Alice drawing a crowd, shame they can't be reissued separate from the shows as I really love the musical styles here and I have only been able to find old 1930's re releases of Phil's work on CD with a best of which is a mixed bag but still very good. As I am a big fan of this Golden Age comedy I have really enjoyed being able to listen and collect this very well restored and presented CD's from radio spirit. I think it is a shame that they have not been able to release all the other great Golden Age shows they release in the same way all in the correct order rather mixes of old and new. The only other show they have treated the same way in any detail is the Green Hornet with the CD releases tracking the masked hero's adventures more or less in order.
