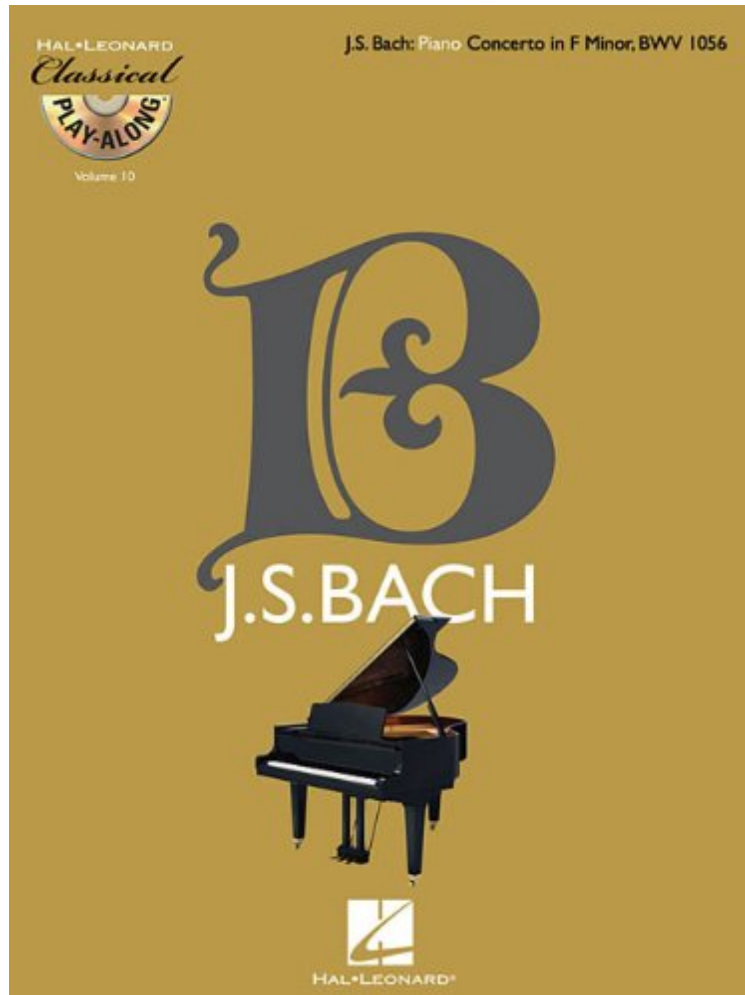

1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. Tempo adjustment problemsBy David CooperThere are a couple problems with the CD that accompanies the sheet music for the way we want to use it. The CD comes with a version of Amazing Slow Downer that works only with Hal Leonard CDs on a computer. My teenage son uses his iPod in a player when he practices piano, so having to play the CD on a computer doesn't really help. Also, the play-along versions of each movement are inexplicably divided up into 30 or 40 second sections, so the first movement is on the CD as tracks 4 through 9. If you play the CD on a CD player, you get at least 4 pauses sporadically in each

movement. For the way that we want to use it, we had to stitch the pieces of each movement together in Garageband then put them on an iPod to practice with. Even with that work, we still have only recordings of the play-along tracks at full tempo, which is not really useful to someone learning the piece. In short, for the CD to be truly useful Hal Leonard should offer orchestra-only play-along movements that aren't divided up into different tracks, and they should include software that can save tempo-altered files that are playable on iPods. 1 of 2 people found the following review helpful. This book just simply shows all the notes only. No other specific markings or detailed history of the piece / composer.. nothing else just notes only... The biggest downfall of the book is that IT DOES NOT SHOW THE ACCOMPANIMENT'S PART. IT ONLY SHOWS SOLO PIANO PART.. AND JUST MERE NOTES ONLY, NO CRESCENDO/ FORTE ETC MARKINGS WHATSOEVER - WHAT ARE THEY THINKING?? In my opinion, it's very important to see what's going on for the accompaniment side- the publisher should recall these and reprint with the accompaniment showing on the same page as the solo part.
